

A Note From District Governor Tony Williams

Greetings from DG Tony Williams:

People often ask me why I became a Rotarian. I became a Rotarian first because I was asked to come to a club meeting and second because I found the eradication of polio to be one of the main areas of service for Rotary International. When I share the story of one of my childhood friends contracting polio at the age of five and he never ran again or was able to climb, I can remember so clearly how it felt to think about how severe a disease it was. I knew then, if an organization was working to make sure polio is never able to cripple another child I wanted to be a part of that organization. As I made my visits throughout the district and asked how many people knew someone who had been affected by polio, there are always hands raised. But, thankfully the number of hands raised is not as many as would have been 30 years ago. I wonder if those who are not aware of how polio affected so many really realize the blessing of living in a country where there is not a threat of hearing that diagnosis for a family member.



Because of the help Bill and Melinda Gates are offering to help triple the efforts of the fund-raising for the cause of making sure polio is eradicated throughout the whole world, we have the opportunity to increase our energies and work hard to ensure no one in the world has to hear a doctor tell them their child has this dreadful disease. Just think – 99.9% of the people in the world have been vaccinated against this disease. Since so many people have never heard of polio affecting anyone they know personally, it is hard to imagine the reason for increasing the support for those still in the fight. That could be farther than the truth. We have the power and are THIS CLOSE! to ridding the world of polio.

Update on Our District 6460 Menghini Scholar, Emiliano Vera

Editor's Note: Emiliano Vera is the recipient of the District 6460 William Menghini Ambassadorial Scholarship. Emiliano is attending college in Mexico. He has written the following report after beginning classes in Mexico.

Hi all,

It's been a while since my last update, but it's been a great time here.

It's the rainy season and it has rained every day that I have been in Mexico, always between 3-7 pm interestingly. One day we had an earthquake siren go off in class, but it was so small that I couldn't even feel anything.

I enjoy my classes a lot, and my professors are really advanced in their field. One professor for a social communications class has worked in for several big companies like Coca-Cola.

Another professor is Australian and speaks Spanish with an accent, so my mind has to work a bit more when I respond to him.

My last professor is the most interesting to me. She focuses on migration in the Middle East and North Africa and she has some amazing experiences that she shares with us in class. For example, as part of her studies she once crossed the entire Sahara desert, passing through 6 countries and never once seeing a border or having to show her passport. She speaks probably 6 African languages. I want to work closely with her as I move into more independent research.

To make sure I stay active, I enrolled in a belly dancing class. I wanted to take the salsa and bachata class, but because all of my classes are at night, the belly dancing one was the only one that fit with my schedule. I'm the only male in the class, and probably the only male that has been in that class in a long time, and the professor by habit kept using female pronouns, only to remember every now and then and correct herself.

I've been meeting more friends outside of the university than inside. Mexican college students like to party more than I can handle, while many of the students are significantly older than me. I've made several friends through the local Rotaract clubs though.

Which brings me to some exciting news - I'm in the process of joining the Rotaract Club of Puebla Colonial! I got invited by a good friend that I was on exchange with in Thailand who is from a nearby town. We meet on Monday nights and then have a "compañerismo" or friendship session afterwards at a local bar. They have all been really great to me and I hope to be a full member soon.

I've also been able to see some family in Mexico. This past weekend we had a big family reunion in Mexico City at my aunt's house to welcome my arrival (even though I've almost been here a month, but everything is a bit behind in Mexican time). She likes to do things over the top, so she decked the house out in full Mexican theme, made everyone wear traditional Mexican clothing, and hired a mariachi band.

Hope everything is going well, and I don't envy your impending fall and winter.


