Ptext

Ptext (Personalized Text Message) is similar to Pmail (Personalized Email)


This is a great way to notify members if there is a cancellation at the last minute or a very important announcement.


Who can Ptext?

- 1. Level 2 can Ptext anyone on a committee they belong to.
- 2. By default, Level 3 and above can Ptext all members of their club.

Information needed in member's record to Ptext

- 1. Click on "My Club", scroll down to the member's record and click on the "pencil" to edit their record. Click on the contact tab and scroll down to the phone section.
- 2. Enter the member's cell phone number with area code and the cell phone carrier, then click on update.
- 3. If you do not know the carrier you can visit 411.com to find that information.



Sending the Ptext


1. To send a Ptext to all members of your club, click on the My Club tab and on second menu bar click on Ptext.



2. On the next screen, select the members you want to send the Ptext to, indicate the Subject and your short Text Message. The message is limited to 160 characters. Click the Send Text button to send your message.



3. To send a Ptext to a committee (you must be a member of the committee), click on My Club, and My Club Committees on the left navigation bar. Then click on the cell phone icon next to the committee name.





1. Depending on your level, you will be able to Ptext different clubs. To Ptext a club, click on the Clubs tab, click on the cell phone icon next to the club name and follow the same procedures as above.
